The recent Supreme Court ruling Ledbetter v. Goodyear makes it virtually impossible for employees who face pay discrimination based on sex, race, ethnicity, religion, disability, and age to take action against their employers. It is time for the Senate to take action to reverse the Ledbetter v Goodyear Supreme Court decision.

The week of Equal Pay Day begins on April 21st and we are urging the Senate to mark this occasion and honor America's workforce by passing the Fair Pay Restoration Act (S. 1843) and making this bill a law.
